The Digital Picket Line: How Australian Unions are Innovating to Rebuild Collective Power in the Workplace

Union membership has been in decline in Australia for over 30 years. Yet trade unions are still the representative voice of more than 1.5 million workers. This seminar will explore the position, strategies and revitalisation of the Australian union movement, with discussion of innovative union prototypes (eg Hospo Voice, Hair Stylists Australia and Game Workers Unite) and digital campaign tools for countering wage theft, inequality and unsafe work. Professor Forsyth will examine priority areas for labour law reform to empower unions to effectively represent workers into the future.
