Submissions will be considered only if they are accompanied by a completed Publication Policy available from the *Review* website. In accordance with the Publication Policy, the *Review* does not accept articles that have already been published or are under consideration by other publications.

The advisory word limit for submissions is 8000 to 12 000 words.

Citation in the *Review* is governed by the *Australian Guide to Legal Citation*. It is preferred if submissions are formatted in accordance with the *AGLC*. Bibliographies should not be included. Citations should be in the form of footnotes. The *AGLC* is written and published by the Melbourne University Law Review Association Inc in collaboration with the Melbourne Journal of International Law Inc. It is available for purchase at a cost of A\$20.00 (including GST), plus postage and handling. The *AGLC* can also be viewed free of charge on the *Review* website.
