Students without a law degree from a common law jurisdiction must complete 'Fundamentals of the Common Law' as one of their subjects.

Graduate Diploma in Construction Law: 50 points (four 12.5 point subjects) from these lists; at least 37.5 points from the 'Construction Law subjects' list. Students without a law degree from a common law jurisdiction must also complete the preliminary weekend subject 'Australian Legal Process and Legal Institutions'.
