**Dominique Allen** is an Associate Professor in the Department of Business Law and Taxation at Monash University and the Director of the Labour, Equality and Human Rights research group (LEAH). Dominique is a socio-legal scholar researching anti-discrimination law, equality, sexual harassment and the role of ADR in resolving legal disputes. She has published widely on these topics in Australia and internationally and is a coauthor of Australian Anti-Discrimination and Equal Opportunity Law (The Federation Press, 2018).



Alysia Blackham is an Associate Professor at Melbourne Law School, the University of Melbourne. Her research focuses on the intersection between equality law, labour law, and public law, using socio-legal and empirical research methods to cast new light on legal problems. Alysia held an Australian Research Council Discovery Early Career Researcher Award grant from 2017–20, and has published widely in the UK, Europe and Australia. Her award-winning books include Extending Working Life for Older Workers: Age Discrimination Law, Policy and Practice (Hart, 2016) and Reforming Age Discrimination Law: Beyond Individual Enforcement (OUP, 2022).
