The Hon Peter Gray AM studied law at the University of Melbourne and at Oxford University. He practised at the Victorian Bar, specialising in labour law. He spent 29 years as a Judge of the Federal Court of Australia. He is the youngest judge appointed to that court and its longest-serving judge. He also served as a Judge of the Industrial Relations

Court of Australia, a Presidential Member of the Administrative Appeals Tribunal, and a Deputy President of the National Native Title Tribunal. In the 1990s he was the Aboriginal Land Commissioner, hearing land rights claims in the Northern Territory.

Since his retirement in 2013, Peter has pursued his interest in forensic linguistics. He has gained a Master of Applied Linguistics from the University of New England. He has taught about language and communication in the legal system at Monash Law School and Swinburne Law School.

Peter's life-long hobby is public speaking. He has been a member of Rostrum for over 50 years and still attends meetings. He is an accredited coach and trainer of Rostrum Victoria. He enjoys helping and encouraging people who want to improve their presentation skills.
