Master of Construction Law - Students must complete **eight subjects** in total. At least seven need to be from the lists on this page, and at least five need to be from the Construction Law list. Students without a law degree from a common law jurisdiction must complete *Fundamentals of the Common Law* as one of their eight subjects. Students with a law degree can choose one of their subjects from any in the Melbourne Law Masters other than *Fundamentals of the Common Law*.

Graduate Diploma in Construction Law - Students must complete **four subjects** from these lists. At least three must be from the Construction Law list. Students without a law degree from a common law jurisdiction are expected to undertake, in addition, *Australian Legal Process and Legal Institutions*.

Continuing Professional Development: Eligible students can also enrol on a single subject basis, with or without assessment, for CPD purposes. See: <http://law.unimelb.edu.au/study/single-subjects/masters>
